A BIG-HEARTED not-for-profit company is helping give children in Africa a brighter future.

One of Big Society's directors, Mark Ereira-Guyer, was inspired by the work being done for orphans in Zambia when he visited so vowed to help when he returned home to Bury St Edmunds.

Mark, who is also a local Green councillor, contacted Reboot Cambridge CIC, which recycles computers, and the CIC bought two laptops to send to the orphanage project.

The project, run by wildlife guide James Zulu, aims to give shelter to the orphans and provide them with skills to have a happier and more secure future.

James Zulu said: "The children were so excited when they received the laptops. They were crowding around and could not wait for me to show them what they could use them for. They will make a huge difference to their lives and learning."

Mark said: "I am pleased this small donation has made a big difference to many children. It would be great if any other local organisations or individuals could see if they have any computers they could donate, to help even more disadvantaged children."
