

Engagement & Legacy Development Project

Breaking New Ground has appointed the Big Society Funding CIC team to deliver an 'Engagement and Legacy Development Project' over the next two months. As a five-year old Community Interest Company they have a track record of delivering community engagement, consultations and partnership development work in both urban and rural settings; and successful experience of generating fresh income streams, innovation and bringing on-board fresh ideas, people and organisations to sustain community-based initiatives.

Their key role is now focused on creating **Engagement and Legacy Development** proposals for *Breaking New Ground* with the goal of developing a legacy for the existing scheme and the team will be:

- Producing a report and plan with refreshed objectives, projects, partners and associated outcomes; and undertaking a related review of the scheme area, results and outcomes secured thus far, and the continuation of the partnership and its composition
- Recommending future funding opportunities including an assessment of the potential for a second HLF Landscape Partnership grant application.

The team will be circulating an on-line survey and future project proposal pro-forma, hold one-to-one and small group meetings with natural and built heritage organisations, and co-ordinate two networking events at Brandon Country Park on Wednesday 13th April, at 4pm and in Thetford (Thursday 14th April, again at 4pm; venue TBC).

The team is working to an exacting timeline, producing the report in mid to late April 2016; and presenting it to the *Breaking New Ground* Board on 27th April.
